



SEEKING: SAM4SRHR CHAMPIONS X 6

CHoiCe Trust, a Non-Profit organisation operating in Limpopo Province, is seeking 6 SAM4SRHR Champions (Social Accountability Monitoring (SAM) Champions) who are responsible for supporting with reaching the targets of the SAfAIDS Transforming Lives Programme in the Mopani District. This programme is to be implemented by CHoiCe Trust on behalf of SAfAIDS as part of the Global Fund initiative and works to contribute towards a more conducive policy environment that enables positive Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) outcomes among adolescent girls and young women (AGYW) in the targeted area. SAM Champions will work at the local level to mobilize and engage with girls and young women between the age of 15 - 24 years towards improved reporting and advocacy around access to health services, contributing to the delivery of health services in the poverty-stricken rural areas of Limpopo Province.

Role Requirements:

The appointed individual is expected to have the following experience and qualifications:

- A female who is aged from 18 – 30 (an adolescent girl or young woman)
- A Matric Certificate is required; post graduate diplomas or certificates in community of health development themes will be an advantage
- Experience in community mobilisation and community work
- Knowledge of Sexual Reproductive Health Rights
- Experience in working with youth, especially adolescent girls and young women (AGYW)
- Good communication skills, including English and at least one local language
- Computer and mobile phone literacy
- Proficiency in the compilation of written reports
- Residing within walking distance from the following health facilities: (Ba Phalaborwa) Lulekani CHC: (Greater Giyani) Giyani CHC and Makhuva clinic; (Greater Tzaneen) Maake and Motupa Clinic).

The SAM4SRHR Champion must be able to work independently, have good communication skills, be detail-oriented, well organised and deadline driven. The individual must have tenacity, patience, passion for working with people, be accurate and precise. They must be able to work towards set targets and have a passion for working with Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) as peers.

The SAM4SRHR Champion must be able to work independently, be detail-oriented and deadline driven. They must be able to work towards the provision of overall data accuracy and reaching programme targets.
