CHoiCe Trust, a NPO serving as a Sub-Recipient to NACOSA for the implementation of the My Journey programme funded by Global Fund, is recruiting key positions for this work in Polokwane sub-district, Limpopo Province. The My Journey programme provides a comprehensive package of health, psychosocial and empowerment services for Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW), supporting them to make informed choices and reduce their risk of HIV infection, ensuring access to youth-friendly sexual and reproductive health services.

As part of this initiative, CHoiCe is recruiting dedicated, community-focused individuals who are passionate about supporting young women and promoting health and wellbeing. This includes a Peer Educator who would join the existing team.

The purpose of this position is to act as a trusted, community-based advocate who bridges the gap between vulnerable young women and essential health, social, and rights-based services. As part of the "My Journey" and DREAMS initiatives, they are central to reducing HIV incidence, teenage pregnancy, and gender-based violence (GBV).

Required Qualifications, Skills and Qualities:

The appointed individual is expected to have the following experience and qualifications:

- Matric/Grade 12 certificate
- Residence in or near the assigned sub-district
- Fluency in local language(s) spoken in the area will be an added advantage
- Experience in peer education, youth work and community outreach
- Exposure to HIV prevention, SRH or GBV programmes
- Basic understanding of HIV, Tb, STIs, contraception and human right
- Strong communication, interpersonal and facilitation skills
- Ability to work in a team and maintain confidentiality
- Sensitivity to gender, stigma and discrimination issues

The Peer Educator must be able to work independently, have good communication skills, be detail-oriented, well organised and deadline driven. The individual must have tenacity, patience, and passion for working with people, be accurate and precise. They must be able to work towards set targets and have a passion for working with Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW)

- Implementation of quality services
- Support mental health and psychosocial support needs.
- Stakeholder engagements
- Monitoring and Reporting
- General Support
